Jesus Twelve Disciples (Part 06 - Bartholomew)

(Mark 3:13-19)

Twelve disciples of Jesus

- (a). Teacher mentions the names of Jesus' 12 disciples and asks the children to recall the names:
- ► Simon Peter ► James ► John ► Andrew ► Philip ► Bartholome
- (b). Every disciple of Christ needs:
- ► To be honest and righteous in God's eyes
- ► To give glory to God through words and actions

II. <u>Lesson From Bartholomew</u>

- ► Batholomew, Philip's close friend
- (a). Several occasions showed that Philip knitted closely to Bartholomew Mat. 10:3 Mrk. 3:18 Luk. 6:14
- (b). Bartholomew was also known as Nathanael
- (c). Negative side of Nathanael as one of Jesus' disciples:
- (1). Prejudice/Labelling John 1:45-46
- ► In Nathanael's mind all people in Nazareth were bad-influence-Society
- ► Prejudice is an unreasonable dislike for a person, group, custom, etc., especially when it is based on their race, belief, cultural background, etc.
- ► As a christian we are not meant to be a prejudiced person. We are never given a right to put a negative label to others
- ► Examples of negative labels: "You are a naughty girl" "Silly boy" "Hello Shorty" "You're chicken", etc

Teacher's testimony about labelling: What are the impacts and how are you supposed to treat others?

- (d). Positive side of Nathanael as one of Jesus' disciples:
- (1). Meek & Gentle John 1:46
- ▶ If you are meek & gentle, it means that you are easily directed to the correct paths
- ► When Philip urged him to see Jesus, he willingly went out with him (even though he initially doubted that nothing good can come out of Nazareth)
- ► The Scripture commands us not to harden our heart Heb. 3:15
- ▶ Memory Verse: "Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion." Heb. 3:15
- 2. A Person in whom was no deceit John 1:47
- ► Every believer should practice honesty in daily life
